Update July 2023

Prestige coaching used for lunchtime activities. We have attended a wide range of events and competitions throughout the year. Some of these events have been targeted at individuals and groups of pupils, dependent on their identified needs and abilities. Other events, for example year 5 triathlon, have been targeted at whole cohorts of children. Please see above the percentages for pupils attending events and clubs.

School have invested in the OPAL programme to ensure that there is a wider variety of physical activities available to children throughout lunchtime. It is recognized that not all children wish to engage in traditional sporting activities such as football, and so a wider range of play-based activities are being provided that will develop children's gross motor skills. A separate action plan for OPAL is completed with the Leadership Team and school's OPAL mentor.

In addition, year 4 children attended an outdoor adventure activity centre for the day and year 6 completed a one-week residential experience to an outdoor adventure centre in Bude.

Update July 2023: we have subscribed to Getset4PE for almost a year. Teachers are more confident following planning with progression. We now have a comprehensive curriculum map which encompasses progression in knowledge and skills. We have recently renewed subscription to sustain the quality of teaching P.E.

In the academic year 2023-2024, PE will be taught by all teaching staff across EYFS, KS1 and KS2 and it is therefore recognized that some staff may require additional CPD and training opportunities, which can be accessed by GetSet4PE, to ensure the best quality provision is provided.
